JFH COUNCIL CHAIR REPORT 2010-2011

A highlight of the past year was the celebration of Jane's Silver jubilee, marked by a range of activities and events. It was pleasing to see the involvement of the entire Jane community, from current students to many of our most senior members. Many former residents visited the College, old friendships were renewed and new friendships established.

As mentioned in the Principal's report, an important start was made during the year to the College's development plan, with the creation of new car parking facilities. Council has maintained its close contact with the University Administration over how it will fund the main part of the plan and has co-operated closely with the development of an integrated University-wide student accommodation plan. Council is hoping that the University will soon be in a position to clarify its approach to our plans.

Towards the end of the year Council bade farewell to Dr John Tooth, who retired in February 2011, after 21 years of service, 14 of them as Chair. The College is fortunate to have had the benefit of his wisdom and wise counsel over so many years and wishes him well for the future.

College life has continued to flourish with an ever-expanding range of activities organized by students and staff. The sense of collegiality is high, and great credit goes to the Principal and his staff for not only maintaining and improving the fabric of the College and the food available to residents, but for the suite of intangible activities and attitudes that lie at Jane's heart. Council expresses its thanks to the Principal and all College staff for their dedication to College life during the past year.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

The College commenced the year with full occupancy from a capacity of 195 but this declined to 99% by the end of second semester. There were 5 full time and 22 part time staff, supplemented by casual tutors and service providers.

During the year a series of events were held to commemorate the 60th Anniversary of the founding of the College in 1950. Highlights included the launch of a book detailing the history of the College and Official Receptions at both Government House and the Town Hall.

The College secured sufficient funding for Stage 1 of the Hobart City Council approved Redevelopment project. This will permit the construction of an extension to link the Horton and Aldridge buildings.

As part of the condition of approval by the HCC the College was required to construct additional car parking spaces onsite which has significantly increased the amount of secure parking available to residents.

Relevant statistics for enrolment and examinations are attached to this report.

I would again like to record my appreciation to the staff, Fellows, Council members and residents at Jane for all their support throughout the year.
