The module takes approximately 20 minutes to complete


Learning requirements

You will need a computer with network/Internet access and you must be a current university staff member to access the learning management system.





Exploring Vista tutorial: the Teach View

Layout of screen in Course View

Three main components are visible:

1. Course Toolbar – where you access the main teaching tools.
 - Grade Book
 - Group Manager
2. Course Management Toolbar – where you access background tools for managing students and the course
 - Course Management Tools
3. Main screen - where much of the teaching and interaction with students occurs, and where the links to content and embedded tools are.
