

EndNote and Taylor and Francis Online

Importing records from Taylor and Francis databases can be done directly without the need for an EndNote filter.

From Taylor and Francis Online...

- Perform a search
- Select the checkbox next to the citation you want to save (you can only export only one citation at a time)
- Click on the title of the article
- Click the **Download Citation** link at the bottom of the Abstract
- From the Download Citation window, under **Choose format** select: **RIS (ProCite, Reference Manager)** For EndNote, ProCite, RefWorks, and most other reference management software. Under **Include**, select the option you want.
- Click **Download citations**

Download Citation

Download a citation file in RIS format that can be imported by citation management software including EndNote, ProCite, RefWorks and Reference Manager.

Choose format

RIS (ProCite, Reference Manager) *For EndNote, ProCite, RefWorks, and most other reference management software*

BibTex *For JabRef, BibDesk, and other BibTeX-specific software*

RefWorks Direct Export *Export document citations into your RefWorks database*
