


EndNote and Wiley Online Library

Importing records from Wiley Online Library can be done directly without the need for an EndNote filter. Although Wiley Online Library contains the fulltext of articles, only brief citations will be loaded into your EndNote Library.

In Wiley Online Library ...

- Perform a search.
- Mark the citations you want to save by clicking the checkbox against the desired citation
- Click on the button **Export Citation** at the top or bottom of the results list. An Export Citation window appears
- From the **Format** dropdown menu, select **EndNote**
- From the **Export Type** dropdown menu, select **Citation and Abstract**
- Click the **Submit** button

- When the **File Download** window appears, Click on **Open**. EndNote will engage.

In EndNote ...

- Your database records should now be loaded into the EndNote library you have open. If you don't have an EndNote library open, records will be loaded into the library you last had open.

Always check your imported citations as editing may be required.
