


## EndNote and Engineering Village

Importing records from Engineering Village databases can be done directly without the need for an EndNote filter.

### In an Engineering Village database ...

- Perform a search
- From the list of articles retrieved, mark the desired records by clicking on the checkbox against the record.
- Click the **Detailed record** button at the top or bottom of the list of citations.
- Click on the **Download** button at the top or bottom of the list of citations.
- You are presented a **Download Selected Records** screen.

- Click on the **RIS, EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager** button
- Click the **Download** button

### In Endnote ...

- Your database records should now be loaded into the EndNote library you have open. If you don't have an EndNote library open, records will be loaded into the library you last had open.

Always check imported citations as editing may be required.
