

EndNote and SciVerse Scopus

Importing records from SciVerse Scopus can be done directly without the need for an EndNote filter.

In SciVerse Scopus ...

- Perform a search
- Click on the checkbox next to each desired record, or select **All** or **Page**
- **Click on Export** at the top of your Results list
- From the **Output: Export, Print, E-mail or create a Bibliography** screen, select the **Export** button at the top of the screen
- Select from **Export format: RIS Format (Reference Manger, ProCite, EndNote)**
- Select one of the following options for the **Output: Citations only**, or **Abstract format**, or **Abstract format with references** or **Complete format** or **Specify fields to be exported**
- Click on the **Export** button under **Output**

- Click the **Open** button. EndNote will engage

In EndNote ...

- Your database records should now be loaded into the EndNote library you have open. If you don't have an EndNote library open, records will be loaded into the library you last had open.

Always check imported citations as editing may be required.
