

EndNote and JSTOR

Importing records from JSTOR can be done directly without the need for an EndNote filter. **However, while you can export citations, you must first be registered as a user with the JSTOR database if you want to save citations within JSTOR.**

- Perform a search in JSTOR.
- Click on the checkbox next to each desired citation on a single page of search results.

If you only want to Export Citations, go to the next bullet point below.

To Save Citations:

Click on the **Save Citation** button to save citations marked on the page, before proceeding to another page in your results list. If you have not logged in to your personal JSTOR account, you will be requested to log in

Click on the **MyJSTOR** menu button at the top of the screen, and select the **Saved Citations** link in the menu below. You are taken to a *My Saved Citations* screen
Click on the checkboxes next to the citations you wish to import into EndNote

- Click on the **Export citations** button. You are taken to an *Export Citations* screen

- Click on the link **RIS file (EndNote, ProCite, Reference Manager)**
A *File Download* dialog window appears

From the File Download dialog window ...

- Click on the **Open** button. EndNote will engage.

In EndNote ...

- Your database records should now be loaded into the EndNote library you have open. If you don't have an EndNote library open, records will be loaded into the library you last had open.

Although JSTOR has the fulltext of articles, only brief citations will be loaded into your library.

Always check imported citations as editing may be required.
