In PubMed...

- Perform a search
- Click on the checkboxes to mark the desired citations you want to save
- From the **Display settings** link at the top of the results list of citations, click on the dropdown menu, select **MEDLINE** and click **Apply**

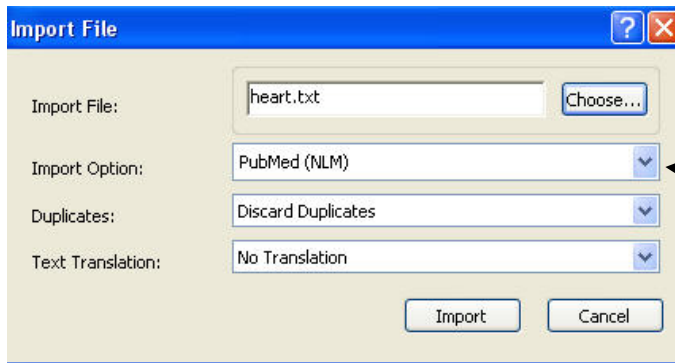

- You are displayed the marked citations in a tagged format
- From the **File** menu in the WWW browser, select **Save Page As**
- Follow your WWW browser's prompts and save the file with a .txt extension as a text file e.g. *heart.txt* to an appropriate place on your computer or disk

In EndNote ...

- Ensure that your EndNote library is open
- Click the  icon, or select **Import** from the **File** menu. An **Import File** dialogue window is opened.
- Click the **Choose...** button and select the text file of citations you saved on your computer
- From the **Import Option** dropdown menu, select the PubMed (NLM) filter. If the filter is not listed, click on **Other Filters...**, select PubMed (NLM) from the list of filters and click on the **Choose** button
- From the Duplicates dropdown menu, select **Discard Duplicates** or **Import All**
- In the **Text Translation** box, select **No Translation**
- Click on the **Import** button



Choose the correct filter from the list of Other Filters...

- Your database records should now be loaded into your open EndNote library. If you don't have an EndNote Library open, EndNote will be activated and the records will be loaded into the library you last had opened
