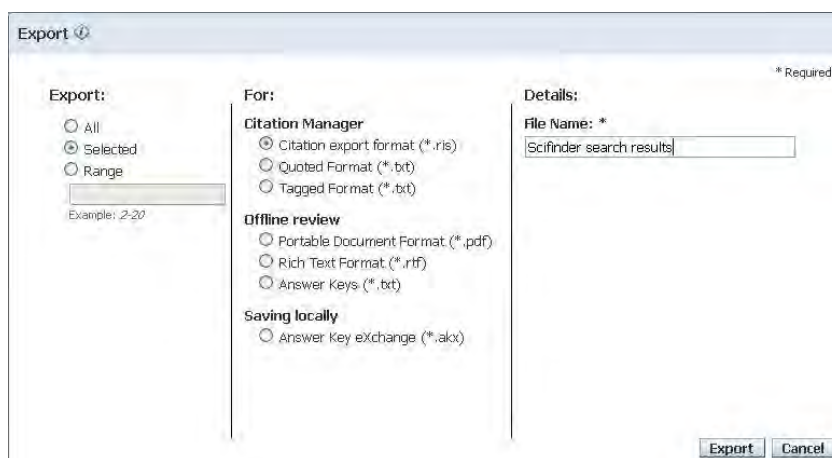


## EndNote and SciFinder

Importing records from SciFinder can be done directly without the need for an EndNote filter.

### In SciFinder...

- Perform a search
- Click the **Export** link at the top right hand side of the search results page
- In the *Export* window, under the **Export:** heading ensure **Marked** is selected
- Under the heading **For: Citation Manager**, select **Citation export format (\*.ris)**
- It is optional under the heading **Filename:** to provide a meaningful filename
- Click the **Export** button



You are displayed an *Opening Reference* window with the filename

- Select **Open with (Research Soft Direct Export Helper (default))**
- Click **OK**

### In EndNote...

Your database records should now be loaded into the EndNote library you have open. If you don't have an EndNote library open, the records will be loaded into the library you last had open.
