## Introduction

The aim of the Corporate Governance Major is to enable corporate, public sector, and not-for-profit organisation executives to fulfil their accountability roles to stakeholders to whom they are responsible, but who do not wish to become accounting practitioners. Graduates will understand how to manage corporate risk, monitor standards and ensure compliance with the laws which authorise and regulate companies and their commercial activities.
