



## Guide to flexible study in the MBA 2009-2010

**Core units in the MBA are offered face-to-face during the week in Hobart (including some evening classes), fortnightly on Saturdays in Hobart and Launceston, and as flexible units (no face-to-face study required). *The online enrolment page will allow you to choose a mode for each unit.***

**Domestic students** can choose to study in whichever mode they prefer. This can include taking some units flexibly and some face-to-face, or all units in one mode.

**International students** can only take up to one quarter of their degree as flexible units. For the MBA, this means up to 3 flexible units, and for the MBAS, this means up to 4 flexible units for the entire degree. You must have at least one face-to-face unit in each compulsory semester (semester 1 and semester 2). However, if you are an international student who is not on a student visa, these rules do not apply, and you can follow the same guidelines as domestic students.

## Evening classes (Hobart)

Some postgraduate units offered in Hobart are taught in evening classes. This is the standard arrangement for the core units of the Master of Professional Accounting (MPA), and some of these units are allowed as substitutions for core units in the MBA. Where a substitution is permitted, the MPA unit covers the same basic material as the MBA unit, but it will be focussed on the needs of accountants.

The Faculty of Business is also looking at expanding the range of elective units available to part-time students, and to this end has scheduled BMA787 Entrepreneurship to be taught fortnightly in an evening slot in semester two. This allows both full-time and part-time students to take this unit. Other evening electives will be introduced in due course.
