

EndNote and AustLit

In AustLit ...

1. Perform a search.
2. From a list of retrieved references, mark the desired references by clicking on the checkboxes
3. Scroll down the screen to the *Select works* box
4. Click on the **Marked** option
5. At the heading *Show on the screen formatted as:* dropdown menu select **Tagged Text**
6. Click **Show**. Your selected references are displayed in a tagged format.

NOTE MAC USERS: After step 6 cut and paste references into a Word document and save as a text file with a **.txt** extension.

Importing data from your AustLit text file into an Endnote Library

From EndNote...

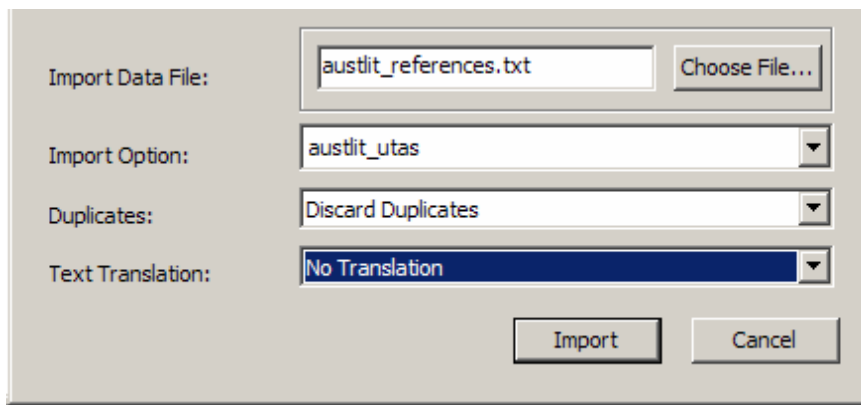
- Ensure your EndNote library is open.



- Click the Import icon

Or select **Import** from the **File** menu.

An **Import** dialogue window is opened.



- Click on **Choose File**
- Select the text file of references saved from your database search.
- From the **Import Option** dropdown menu, select the austlit_utas filter. If the filter is
- If the filter is not listed, click on **Other Filters**. You will be shown a list of filters and select austlit_utas filter. Click on **Choose**.
- From the **Duplicates** dropdown menu, either select **Import All** or **Discard Duplicates**.
- In the **Text Translation** box, select **No Translation**.
- Click on the **Import** button.

Your database references should now be loaded into your open EndNote library.
