

EndNote and Ebscohost databases

Importing records from Ebscohost databases can be done directly without the need for an EndNote filter. Although some Ebsco databases have fulltext articles, only brief citations will be loaded into your EndNote library.

From the Ebscohost database...

- Perform a search.
- Mark the citations you want to save by clicking the **Add** link against each desired citation
- Click on the **Folder** or **Folder has items** icon at the top of the screen
- On the *Folder contents* screen, select the citations you want exported to your EndNote library by clicking the Select All checkbox, or by clicking individual checkboxes
- On the *Folder contents* screen, click on the **Export** icon
- On the *Export manager* screen, click the button for Direct Export to EndNote, ProCite, or Reference Manager
- Click **Save** button

In EndNote ...

- A **Select a Reference Library** dialogue window appears.
- Select the library you would like the citations put in and click **Open** (you must do this even when your library is already open).

Your database records should now be loaded into your EndNote library.

Notes:

Always check and correct the imported citations as not all databases import data correctly.
