


## EndNote and ProQuest

Importing records from Proquest databases can be done directly without the need for an EndNote filter. Although ProQuest has fulltext articles in its database, only brief citations will be loaded into your EndNote library.

### In ProQuest ...

- Perform a search.
- Mark the citations you want to save by clicking the checkbox against the citation
- Click on the **My Research** button.
- On the *My Research* screen, click on the **Export citations into Endnote, ProCite, RefWorks or Reference Manager** link (shown below)
- At the next screen click on **Export directly to Procite Endnote or Reference Manager.**

### In EndNote ...

- A **Select a Reference Library** dialogue window appears.
- Select the library you would like the citations put in and click **Open** (you must do this even when your library is already open).

Your database records should now be loaded into your EndNote library.

### Notes:

Always check and correct the imported citations, for example only the starting page is exported.
