

# EndNote and Project MUSE

Importing records from Project MUSE can be done directly without the need for an EndNote filter.

## In Project Muse ...

- Perform a search.
- From the list of titles, mark the desired records by clicking on the checkbox against the record.
- Click on **Save Marked Results**. (You need to click on **Save Marked Results** from each page where you have marked records)
- Click on **E-mail/Export Saved Results** located at the top right of the screen.

- Check the **EndNote** option under the heading '**Export marked results to**'.
- Click on **Export**.

EndNote will present a **Select a Reference Library** dialogue box.

- Select your library and click **Open** (you must do this even when your library is already open).

Your Project MUSE records should now be loaded into your EndNote library.
