

EndNote and Scopus

Importing records from Scopus can be done directly without the need for an EndNote filter.

In Scopus ...

- Perform a search.
- Click on the checkbox next to each desired record, or select **All** or **Page**
- **Click on Output** at the top of your Results list
- From the *Output: Export, Print, E-mail or create a Bibliography* screen, select the **Export** button at the top of the screen
- Select from **Export Format: RIS Format (for Reference Manger, ProCite, EndNote)**
- Select one of the following options for the **Output: Abstract format**, or **Abstract format with references** or **Complete format** or **Specify fields to be exported**
- Click on the **Export** button under the **Output:** dropdown menu. A *File Download* window will appear.

1 Select the desired output type for the 3 selected documents.

Export Print E-mail Bibliography

2 **Export:** Choose your preferences and click **Export**.

Export format: RIS format (Reference Manager, ProCite, EndNote)

Output: Abstract format

Note: Output may not be complete for non-Scopus documents.

Return Export

From the *File Download* window...

- Click the **Open** button. EndNote will engage.

In EndNote ...

- A *Select a Reference Library* dialogue window appears.
- Select the library you would like the citations put in and click **Open** (you must do this even when your library is already open).

Your database records should now be loaded into your EndNote library.
