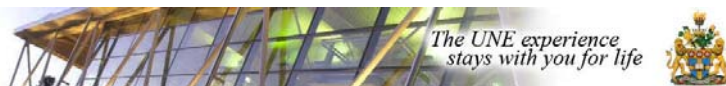

Want to study Indonesian on location?

Enrol in an in-country Indonesian language program that gives you immersion-in-culture and daily interaction with people.

Supportive local university teachers integrate rigorous coursework with interesting cultural activities and excursions. Rewarding experiences living in the community, whilst studying, will enrich your understanding of the Indonesian language and way of life.

The University of Tasmania in conjunction with Charles Darwin University, the University of New England, the University of the Sunshine Coast and Mataram University offers intensive language programs in Lombok, Indonesia.

The in-country programs are offered at 8 levels, from total beginners to advanced. Choose to study one unit over three weeks, or two units consecutively over six weeks. UTAS and other students can gain credit towards their degree program. Available also to people not currently studying at university.

Cost

HECS on the units you undertake (paid as you normally pay your HECS)
