The Launceston and Morris Miller libraries have lifts that can be used by students to access all floors of the library. The Clinical Library has lift access to the library, from the Utas car park under the building.

The Launceston, Morris Miller, Art, Clinical and Science libraries have toilets suitable for wheelchair access.
