

Integration Fast Facts

- **Integration date:** January 1 2008.
- **How it will work:** The AMC will continue with its current name and logo but become an institute of University of Tasmania, in the same way as the Menzies Research Institute. It will continue to be a national institution for maritime and maritime-related education.
- **AMC location:** The AMC will remain on its current sites although eventually some courses may expand onto UTAS sites and vice versa.
- **Governance:** The AMC will have a Board which will be responsible to the University Council through the Vice-Chancellor.
- **AMC leadership:** The current AMC President position will become Principal of the AMC. The Principal will report to the Board of the AMC.
- **Structure of the AMC:** Future structure will be based around three centres – the National Centre for Maritime Engineering and Hydrodynamics; the National Centre for Marine Environment; the National Centre for Ports and Shipping.
- **Staff changes:** No academic staff will be transferred in the integration, but the AMC's Corporate Services Division will be reduced to about one third of its current size. There will be no compulsory redundancies; many staff will be transferred into job roles in the wider university.
- **Students:** AMC students will have the same rights and privileges as other student of UTAS.
