

## Embedding ECHO 360 videos

PebblePad has a great option where embed codes can be used to display digital media from a wide range of web platforms - eg. Prezi, Padlet, Google Maps – on pages and templates. They now support ECHO 360 and so your videos can be placed directly in workbooks for students.

## Assessors releasing their own feedback

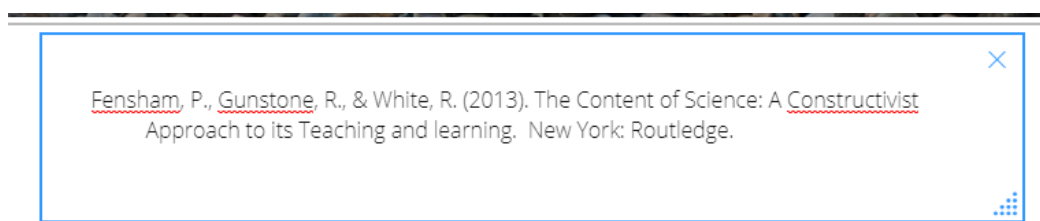
If you use ATLAS to mark Pebble submissions, you might notice that there is a setting in the feedback window where comments can be released immediately or held for later release. This can be rather dangerous if there are several people marking and the results need to be moderated before release.



The default for UTAS has now been set to “assessors can’t release their own feedback”. This means every new workspace at UTAS will start with this feedback setting and the release options will be greyed out in the feedback window (above). If you wish to change to a different option, you can in management > feedback > feedback settings.

## Hanging Indent

The latest release of PebblePad included a ‘hanging indent’ in the formatting bar. This means students can now indent as per APA6 conventions.



## Using Turnitin

Did you know that PebblePad submissions can be processed through Turnitin? The Turnitin link will need to be activated for your region and then you will be able to connect your workspace and assignments.
