ABOUT THIS COURSE

With an ageing population and increased numbers of people living with dementia, it's becoming essential that both personal carers, the aged care workforce and anyone who provides care for people with dementia develop specialised knowledge to provide quality care in homes, communities, health care centres, hospitals, and residential care.

This fully online, eight-unit course is suited to caregivers, aged care, community and health sector workers, and anyone with an interest in learning more about dementia. During this course, you'll gain a deeper knowledge of the condition, the changes that occur in the brain, the behaviours and needs associated with the changes, and the practical strategies necessary to care for people living with dementia.

This course has been developed by the Wicking Dementia Research and Education Centre, global leaders in dementia education. You will learn from multidisciplinary lecturers who are active in dementia research, drawing on the latest data as part of your studies.

Study without tuition fees in 2024

The Diploma of Dementia Care is offered with a 100% tuition fee scholarship for eligible domestic students, which means you can study without any tuition fees. It is also honoured through to graduation.
