


INFECTIOUS DISEASES GUIDELINES AND PROCEDURES

TASMANIAN STUDENT IMMUNISATION RECORD – COMPLETION GUIDE

This completion guide accompanies the Tasmanian Student Immunisation Record which is available from the College of Health and Medicine PEP website.

The University is required to comply with Commonwealth and State legislation and regulations to ensure the safety of students and patients. Faculty of Health has a duty of care towards both students and patients to prevent or minimise the risk of transmission of infectious or blood-borne diseases.

The Tasmanian Student Immunisation Record is to be completed by a health care provider to enable you to comply with the College of Health and Medicine.



The form is titled 'Tasmanian Student Immunisation Record' and includes the following sections:

- PERSONAL DETAILS (reviewed):** Includes fields for Name, Address, Post Code, State, and Date of Birth.
- Adult Immunisation (diphtheria, tetanus, acellular pertussis (whooping cough) vaccine (ADAPT dose of #2a)):** A table with columns for Dose 1, Dose 2, and Dose 3, and a 'Vaccination provided by an overseas country (signature required AND name of overseas country)' column.
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR) vaccine:** A table with columns for Dose 1, Dose 2, and Dose 3, and a 'Vaccination provided by an overseas country (signature required AND name of overseas country)' column.
- Varicella vaccine:** A table with columns for Dose 1, Dose 2, and Dose 3, and a 'Vaccination provided by an overseas country (signature required AND name of overseas country)' column.
- Influenza vaccine:** A table with columns for Dose 1, Dose 2, and Dose 3, and a 'Vaccination provided by an overseas country (signature required AND name of overseas country)' column.

It is recommended that you take this completion guide to your health care provider with your Tasmanian Student Immunisation Record.

Once you have your Tasmanian Student Immunisation Record completed, you are required to:

- Submit your record to InPlace for review and verification by PEP Staff during semester 1 and at other times as requested
- Take your record with you on placement to all facilities on the first day of PEP

If you do not submit your completed Tasmanian Student Immunisation Record to InPlace prior to your first scheduled placement you will not be eligible to undertake PEP and therefore may not be able to complete your course.

STUDENT COMPLETION GUIDE

Cost of the Program: Students are responsible for the costs of all assessment, screening and vaccination requirements.

Evidence: Sources of evidence may include Child Health Records/vaccination clinics, staff health and GP medical records. Students previously immunised in Australia may also be able to download their immunisation history from the [Australian Immunisation Register](#). Serology reports can also be attached. All entries must be legible and in English.

- **ALL ENTRIES MUST INCLUDE DATE, HEALTH CARE PROVIDER SIGNATURE AND NAME/STAMP.**
- **All vaccinations must include batch number, written or with sticker attached**
- Serology and other test results need to be entered onto the record with **date, health care provider signature and name/stamp included**

Instructions for the Student

Evidence of immunity to diphtheria/tetanus/pertussis	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ One dose of the combined adult dTpa (adult diphtheria, tetanus and pertussis vaccine. If no batch number available, a booster dose will be required <i>NOTE: Blood tests and/or ADT will not be accepted</i>
Evidence of Hepatitis B vaccination	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Documented age appropriate course of hepatitis B vaccine. A hepatitis B serology test is required one month after your 3rd Hepatitis B vaccination. A verbal history and written declaration is acceptable if all attempts fail to obtain the vaccination record ✓ And, Hepatitis B serology demonstrating Anti-HBs greater than or equal to 10IU/ml. <i>This must be recorded as a numerical value. No other result will be accepted</i> ✓ If your result is <10IU/ml, you will need to contact the Tasmanian Senior Immunisation Advisor immediately for further advice
Evidence of vaccinations against measles/mumps/rubella	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Documentation of TWO DOSES of measles/mumps/rubella vaccinations at least one month apart ✓ Or positive IgG for Measles and Mumps, <i>with Rubella result recorded as a numerical value.</i> ✓ OR if born before 1966, you are considered immune and no further action is required
Evidence of immunity to Varicella	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Documentation of 2 doses of varicella vaccination at least one month age (evidence of one dose is sufficient if vaccinated before the age of 14; if vaccinated after age 14, 2 x varicella vaccinations are required) ✓ Or positive IgG for varicella
Tuberculosis	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❓ If, upon completion of the mandatory TB Questionnaire, you are identified as requiring TB screening your doctor will refer you to a Respiratory Clinic for a Tuberculin Skin Test/Mantoux ❓ Information regarding high risk countries can be found at: http://www.health.nsw.gov.au/Infectious/tuberculosis/Documents/countries-incidence.pdf
