- Please attach with your EOI: CV, Academic Transcripts and evidence of your English proficiency (if applicable)
- A preliminary assessment will be conducted to verify that the minimum entry requirements are met, following this the proposed project will be considered by the Faculty to identify appropriate supervision (if any)

Application

- Complete an Application for Admission and Scholarship for Higher Degree Research Candidature (PhD, Research Masters and Professional Doctorates).
- Applications, supporting documentation and independent referee reports are to be submitted to Research.Launceston@utas.edu.au
- **International Applicants** should also include certified transcripts of qualification in English, proof of English language ability (IELTS or TOEFL).

Application Assessment

- Applications are assessed by the Faculty Graduate Research Coordinators. Recommendations are then made to the Graduate Research Office (GRO) and where an appropriate offer is made.
- **Scholarships** are administered centrally through the GRO and are a competitive process across the whole university. Note: The Faculty of Education may make a recommendation for a scholarship, however, the decision rests with the University Scholarship Ranking Committee.
- Offers may be for full scholarship, partial scholarship or candidature only (no scholarship). In some cases, no offer will be made.
