## PebblePad Webinars

### 1. How can PebblePad be rolled out for over 30,000 students all at once?

## Embedding Documents on a PebblePad page

Up until recently, the only way to present a document as part of a portfolio was to create a hyperlink. In this scenario, a creator would upload the document to Pebble, create a hyperlink and then the viewer would open the link in a new window and download or view the document. It worked, but it was not particularly elegant.

The new embed options in PebblePad have provided a much better option. A creator can upload the file to one of the Cloud services (eg. One Drive or Google Docs) and obtain the embed code. An embedded document displays directly on the PebblePad page in a neat scrolling window.
