We are here to guide and mentor you while you are on placement and to support you in your learning.

This may include:

Making sure you have access to one-on-one support	Arranging orientation tours of the facility that is hosting you on placement	Helping you work out what to do while you are here
Liaising with your supervisor/preceptor or Unit Coordinator – either with you, or on your behalf	Providing lists of key contacts at the University and in the community and who are the “go to” people if you have any issues or problems	Putting you in touch with other students on placement in your local placement environment
In some cases we may be involved in your supervision and assessment – either directly or indirectly		

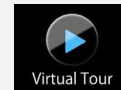
