Proofreading Tips and Checklist

- Critically, understand the difference between editing and proofreading. Editing is the first step which makes corrections to content and language. Be sure that you revise and <u>edit</u> your work first. Corrections in grammar and spelling (i.e. proofreading) will matter less if important elements such as answering the question, organisation and referencing are not evident and accurate.
- ✓ Determine the best medium for proofreading your work (i.e. print or electronic copy)
- Read your essay aloud in many cases you will be able to hear the errors
- ✓ Read from end to beginning, sentence by sentence backwards. This technique will ensure that you don't put words in that are not there.
- ✓ Recognise your weaknesses and keep a catalogue of common errors you make (e.g. its versus it's). Double-check those particular errors at the proofreading stage by using find/replace function.
- ✓ Edit in short bursts (e.g. 30 minutes at a time)
- ✓ Sweep for errors by focusing on one type of error at a time
- ✓ If it doubt, look it up
- ✓ Have someone else read it

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
