Building the capability of the team of Whole of Community Facilitators to enable the provision of high-quality placements across rural areas of Tasmania by enabling and providing high quality professional development opportunities and a good student experience.

Leading and managing the employment, onboarding and retention processes of the Whole of Community Facilitators.

Managing and building strong relations with internal and external stakeholders to maintain high quality placements with partner agencies across Tasmania.

Establishing, maintaining and sustaining placements in rural areas of Tasmania by the provision and support of student placements across a broad range of public, private and non-government healthcare organisations.
