## **Terms and Conditions**

### **Eligibility**

To be eligible, students must:

1. Be classified as female and an International Student as defined under the rules of the University of Tasmania;
2. Have received and accepted an offer of a full-time, on campus place in either [Bachelor of Applied Science \(Marine Engineering\) - 23R](#) or [Bachelor of Applied Science \(Nautical Science\) - 23Q](#) with the Australian Maritime College (this excludes Foundation Studies Program and ELC packaged offers);
3. Be a commencing student with the University of Tasmania on the Launceston Campus (students entering with Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) for studies completed at another institution **are not eligible** for this scholarship).
4. Pay the commencement fee outlined in their Letter of Offer and provide evidence of payment as set out in the Letter of Offer.

### **Application Process**

Students are assessed automatically for this scholarship upon submission of their International Student Application; there is no need to apply separately.

### **Duration**

First year of Study.

### **Amount**

1. \$8000 (equivalent to 100% of on-campus accommodation costs for the first year of study in Launceston), to be paid in two instalments, one per semester.
2. \$2,000 to spend towards educational costs – paid directly to the student’s Australian bank account after census date of their first semester of study.

### **Actions Rendering the Scholarship Void**

1. Students must observe the University's rules of conduct and behaviour otherwise this scholarship will be revoked immediately; and
2. For students to remain eligible for this scholarship they must remain enrolled full-time (100%) in the approved course of study and achieve a minimum Pass (4.0/7.0) result in each unit for the duration they are in receipt of the scholarship.

### **Advertising and Intellectual Property**

1. Recipients of the scholarship authorise the University of Tasmania to use, reproduce, and/or publish their image, their name and story in relation to the bursary without compensation.
2. The material outlined in Clause 1 above may or may not be used in various publications, public affairs releases, recruitment materials, advertising or for other related endeavours.

### **Variation of Terms and Conditions**

The University of Tasmania reserves the right to update or amend these Terms and Conditions at any time.
