Best-practice and innovative career education for parents <u>will involve</u> moving away from an over relicense on traditional forms of information (newsletters, parent information sessions) to interactive forms of information sharing and career conversations. Career education opportunities that aim to inform parental aspirations and raise the value attributed to opportunities are characterised as having the most impact on learning and transition outcomes for young people [reference].

The information and resources presented in this tool-kit are designed to assist school staff plan and organise career events and opportunities for parents/carers. Spending time planning for career events will ensure success and positive outcomes for families, school staff, employers and education providers. The events in this tool-kit were collaboratively planned, organised and facilitated with parents.

## **Career and education strategies for parents/carers:**

### **Speed Careering for Parents**

- An informal way for parents to meet employers and education providers in small groups, and works like Speed Dating restricted to time
- A high intensity session for information sharing with parents and guests





#### **Tours**

 Tours provide opportunity for parents/carers to see schools, colleges, VET and university campuses, meet and talk with staff specific to their child's aspirations

### **Expos**

- An informal way for parents/carers to meet with employers and education providers in a large setting
- Expos enable parents/carers to meet and talk with staff specific to their child's aspirations, and are most effective when aligned with students pathway planning activities at school

### Morning/afternoon teas

- Morning and afternoon teas are an effective strategy for targeted career and education pathway training for parents/carers
- They can be large or small scale, and planned for specific parents/carers and their families information needs







**Speed Careering for Parents** 

Speed Careering for Parents is an interactive and informal strategy to broaden and deepen parents knowledge and understanding of specific job requirements for their children, whilst engaging with a range of different positions found within in a particular industry, sector and professions.



## Easy steps to plan Speed Careering for Parents:

## Step 1: Assemble the organisers

Every successful event needs a group of people to plan and organise it. Gather a small group of parents volunteers to work alongside a school staff member/s to assist with planning and organising. Positive school support is essential providing refreshments at planning meetings, admin support such as photocopying, and a meeting venue. Tap into the wealth of parent skills, networks and contacts that can positively enhance the event.

## Step 2: Determine a date

A great strategy is choosing a date that aligns with career education and learning taking place in the classroom. This creates greater opportunity for richer career conversations at home between parent/child.
